I. DANCE PAYMENT AGREEMENT

Conditions

- Agreement effective for The Rock School's Dance program school-year session September 2011 - June 2012.
- All dance tuition paid to The Rock School is non-refundable and non-transferable.
- Dance tuition includes class instruction and select rehearsals. If a student elects to participate in supplementary performances or activities additional fees may apply.

Payment Terms

- Dance tuition is paid quarterly or an annual, pay-in-full basis.
 - Tuition as outlined in **Dance Tuition Rates 2011-2012** table below.
- Quarterly payment dates are as follows:

- Quarterly payments are defined as four equal installments of the annual tuition rate.
- The full quarter payment must be received prior to the start of the quarter.
- If payment is past due the student may not be permitted to attend class.

Scholarship Acceptance and Agreement

- All scholarship students, City Dance, merit, and young boys, will be subject to his or her Scholarship Acceptance Agreement. A failure to comply will result in a verbal warning.
- Any such verbal warning may be followed by complete revocation of the Scholarship Award.
- All students who receive a Dance scholarship award, full or partial, are subject to a \$50 Scholarship Fee. The Scholarship Fee helps subsidize administrative expenses, necessary to support The School's extensive scholarship programs.

Withdrawal and Dismissal

- If postmarked withdrawal notification or email is not received one week prior to the ending date of the student's final participating quarter her or she is considered to be continuing participation in the subsequent quarter and full quarter payment is required.
- In the event of an expulsion or dismissal by The School Directors, all tuition paid to The Rock School, on behalf of any discharged student, is forfeited by the student.

Online Registration Notice

For the 2011-2012 school-year The Rock School is proud to introduce secure online class registration and payment via The School's System for Tuition, Admission, & Registration (hereinafter "STAR"). STAR is the digital representation of The School's traditional brochure-based registration process. STAR is a fully secure system, certified by SSL, and PCI compliant.

For detailed information about the STAR registration process, please visit therockschool.org/star.

Online Eligibility

All STAR customers must be 18 years old, or older, and American residents. International students will be provided hardcopy registration material.

Online Payments

All STAR online credit and debit card payment is processed by payment gateway Authorize.net, a wholly owned subsidiary of Visa. All sensitive data is stored on Authorize.net PCI-compliant data servers, ensuring secure payment processing. The Rock School is a verified Authorize.net merchant.

Acceptable Forms of Payment

All tuition and fees must be paid to The Rock School in US currency.

STAR accepts Visa, MasterCard, American Express, and Discover debit and credit cards. Check, cash, and wire payment is also accepted. Please contact The School for more information.

Penalties for Failed or Decline Payment

All expenses directly incurred by The Rock School for failed or declined payments will be charged as appropriate to the customer.

IV. PRIVACY POLICIES

The Rock School for Dance Education's System for Tuition, Admission, and Registration Statement of Privacy

The Rock School for Dance Education is committed to protecting your privacy. This Statement of Privacy applies to The Rock School's online System for Tuition, Admission, and Registration (hereinafter "STAR") e-commerce and registration data collection. This policy governs the usage of information provided by you on STAR designated webpages; it does not apply to the offline collection of data or The Rock School's website in its entirety. The Statement of Privacy is found on all The Rock School's STAR webpages.

Personal information provided by you to STAR will be collected, used and disclosed as described in this Statement of Privacy.

Collection of your Personal Information

As an e-commerce and registration site The Rock School's STAR collects personal information, such as your e-mail address, parent contact information, student data, and payment information. Information collected by The Rock School's STAR is used solely for the purpose of billing and completing student registration based on your online purchase.

The Rock School is not responsible for the privacy statements or other content on webpages outside of the The Rock School's STAR webpages.



Use of your Personal Information

The Rock School and its operational service partners, collect and use your personal information to process billing based on class registration requests. This includes issuing billing statements and invoices, to complete the billing process based on the payment plan selected. The Rock School will also use personal information to inform you of School-affiliated events and notices.

The Rock School may also contact you via surveys to conduct research about your opinion of current programs or of potential new programs that may be offered.

The Rock School does not sell or lease its customer lists to third parties.

The Rock School may access and/or disclose your personal information if required to do so by law or in the good faith belief that such action is necessary to: (a) conform to the edicts of the law or comply with legal process served on The Rock School's STAR webpages; (b) protect and defend the rights or property of The Rock School including its STAR webpages; or (c) act under exigent circumstances to protect the personal safety of users of The Rock School or the public.

Personal information collected on this site may be stored and processed in the United States or any other country in which The Rock School or its affiliates, subsidiaries or agents maintain facilities, and by using this site, you consent to any such transfer of information outside of your country.

Control your Personal Information

Security of your Personal Information

The Rock School is committed to protecting the security of your personal information. The School uses a variety of security technologies and procedures to help protect your personal information from unauthorized access, use, or disclosure. When The Rock School transmits highly confidential information (such as a credit card number) over the Internet, it uses a secure payment gateway so your information is protected. The Rock School is a Payment Card Industry Standard Data Security Standard (PCI DSS) organization.

Changes to this Statement

The Rock School will occasionally update this Statement of Privacy to reflect company and customer feedback. If there are material changes to this Statement or in how The Rock School will use your personal information, The Rock School will prominently post such changes prior to implementing the change. The Rock School encourages you to periodically review this Statement to be informed of how The Rock School is protecting your information.

Medical Form Statement of Privacy

The Rock School takes great care in protecting medical information of all students. Student medical forms are securely stored at The Rock School, only made available to authorized staff members, on a need to know basis. Medical forms are made available to medical authorities in case of emergency per The School's Release of Claims and Medical Authorization Form. Academic and Residence students' medical information will be shared with medical authorities, as deemed appropriate within the scope of The School's Care Waiver.

All medical forms for the 2011-2012 school-year session will be shredded and destroyed upon the close of the session. The Rock School will not retain any obsolete student medical information or files.

V. SCHOOL POLICIES

Reserving Your Spot

The Rock School's Dance, Rock Academics, and Residence programs are filled on a first come, first served basis, with priority extended to re-enrolling students in good standing. Programs have limited capacity and it is important to complete the registration process in a timely manner to reserve a space. Please visit therockschool.org/star to review the required registration steps.

Level Placement and Advancement

Each student is placed in one of ten levels for the school year. The progress of each student is monitored continuously throughout the year by the faculty and The Directors, who reserve the right to change a student's level when appropriate.

Please Note: Unlike academic schools, students do not automatically advance to the next level at the end of each year. Emotional maturity, physical development, comprehension, competency of execution, correct body positioning, and adequate body strength may require two years of training at any given level, particularly Level 3 and Level 3X. Students completing Level 2 and those emerging from Level 3X must be able to meet certain minimum standards in order to continue at The Rock School. Questions about student progress must be directed to The Directors and NOT to individual faculty. Final decisions regarding level placement are made by The Directors.

Lockers

Lockers in the student dressing rooms are available to all levels of students. The Rock School will assign all lockers and locks. Lockers are free, but there will be a \$10.00 replacement fee if the lock is missing, lost or damaged. Lockers will be assigned on a first come first served basis. A lock, which is not issued by The Rock School is prohibited. Any lock that is not issued by The Rock School will be removed (cut and discarded). The Rock School reserves the right to open and search lockers if there is a concern regarding students' safety, knowledge of weapons, contraband (i.e. alcohol, drugs, or drug paraphernalia), or stolen materials are stored in the locker. Lockers will also be opened if the environment of the dressing room is found to be unhealthy and unsanitary. To obtain a locker a signed locker agreement is required, which can be obtained at the front office.

Electronic Devices

Students are prohibited from using electronic devices while in the studio, during class time. Including, but not limited to cell phones, gaming systems, and video/digital cameras. School faculty reserves the right to confiscate any and all devices during class, to be returned to the student at the completion of the class.

Scholarships

All Rock School students who receive a Scholarship for the 2011-2012 school-year are subject to The School's Scholarship Acceptance Agreement. A failure to comply will result in a verbal warning. Any such verbal warning may be followed by complete revocation of the Scholarship Award.

Merit - The Rock School offers a limited number of full and partial tuition Merit Dance Scholarships, primarily to students in the upper levels. These scholarships are awarded by The Directors only and are based on talent and ability.

Young Boys - The Rock School is proud to support the training of young male dancers. Scholarships are available to male students, levels Pre-Ballet I through Level 2X, who show an eagerness and commitment to dance.

City Dance - The Rock School's City Dance program enables The School to identify and train talented students, who meet financial based eligibility requirements. Upon acceptance to the program students receive a full tuition scholarship.

Scholarship Fee

All Rock School students who receive a Dance scholarship award, full or partial, are subject to a \$50 Scholarship Fee for the 2011-2012 school-year session. The Scholarship Fee helps subsidize administrative expenses, necessary to support The School's extensive scholarship programs.

Parent Conduct

Please report any problems to The School office immediately. Students and parents are expected to be polite to one another as well as to Rock School employees. Any rude or aggressive behavior from students or parents will not be tolerated. Any use of offensive language or harassment of Rock School employees will result in dismissal without refund. Parents are to not discipline other child, besides their own. They are to report any questionable student behavior direct to a Rock School employee.

Instructor-Student Contact

The Rock School strives to offer teaching that is individual and "hands-on". It is appropriate for a member of the faculty to manually and physically position a pupil to expound a point of instruction or to pinpoint for an individual flaw in his or her technique. The School neither condones nor tolerates any touching of students by instructors that is harmful, professionally reckless, or that violates generally accepted tenets of propriety. Before enrolling a student, please consider that it is The Rock School policy to correct children with physical contact. If the student or parent/guardian is uncomfortable with this policy, they may wish to reconsider enrolling the student.

Parent Observation

Parents, guardians, and relatives of students are invited to view classes during Observation Weeks. One full week each quarter is allotted for observation. Exceptions: Creative Movement and Pre-Ballet parents may observe classes at any time outside the door of the studio. Parents or guardians of non-local resident students may request Director approval to observe class on a day not during an Observation Week.

School Closings

The School's KYW radio code number is 1007. The Rock School follows the Philadelphia School District in its decisions concerning closings due to inclement weather. The Rock School is not responsible for classes canceled as a result of extreme weather conditions or other circumstances beyond the control of The Rock School.

Substance Abuse Policy

The consumption and/or possession of alcoholic beverages are strictly prohibited regardless of the student's age or age of the guest. Violation of this policy may lead to immediate dismissal from the housing and ballet program at The Rock School, as well as being reported to the proper authorities. If you are of age and distribute alcohol to a minor this will also lead to immediate dismissal from The Rock School program, as well as being reported to the proper authorities.

The Rock School forbids the sale, possession, consumption, and storage of illegal drugs and/or controlled substances (as defined under applicable federal and state law). Any evidence of the above will result in immediate dismissal from The Rock School, as well as being turned over to proper authorities. Any type of drug paraphernalia is also prohibited and will be confiscated and turned over to the proper authorities. Immediate dismissal from The Rock School will follow.

Attendance/Tardiness

Students are expected to arrive at The School with sufficient time to properly prepare for the start of their classes and rehearsals. In the interest of injury prevention, The School reserves the right to bar any student who arrives for class late from participating in the class other than as an observer. Chronic lateness constitutes grounds for dismissal from The School.

Students are required to attend all classes and rehearsals to which they are assigned. A student with a minor injury or illness is expected to attend his/ her classes and rehearsals as an alert observer seated inside the studios. To minimize absences, parents are urged to take into consideration lessons and rehearsals when scheduling their children for appointments and when planning family vacations. A student will be excused from class or rehearsal only in the case of serious illness or injury or genuine emergency.

The student's absence must promptly be reported by a parent or by the student to The School Office at 215.551.7010 or via email star@therockschool.net with the subject line ATTENDANCE.

The School reserves the right to dismiss any student with unexcused absences per quarter or on leave from The School for 5 or more class days per quarter. Scholarship students are not exempt from the rules governing attendance.

Dismissal

Every Rock School student is expected to behave in a disciplined, responsible, and courteous manner when on School premises. The School Directors reserve the right to suspend or expel any student at any time whose attitude, class attendance, work habits, overall conduct, or physical fitness for classical dance training is judged unsatisfactory. All tuition paid to The Rock School, on behalf of any discharged student, is forfeited by the student. The Rock School also reserves the right to dismiss any student who has a medical condition that puts him or her or classmates and faculty at risk.

Withdrawal From The School

Any student withdrawing from The School during the course of the 2011-12 school-year must provide The School with written notice of the withdrawal one week prior to the ending date of the student's final participating quarter. If postmarked notification or email is not received by the time stated above the student is considered to be continuing participation in the subsequent quarter and full quarter payment is required.

Dress Code

Female students:

- Creative Movement and Pre Ballet 1 and 2: White leotards (any style), pale pink tights and pink ballet slippers. Skirts are optional.
- Levels 1 through 5: Solid black leotards (any style), pale pink tights, pink ballet slippers and Pointe shoes, if applicable. Skirts may be worn by students in Levels 4 and 5, only during Pointe and Variations classes, at the instructor's discretion. Saturday is color day. Any color leotard may be worn on Saturdays.
- All females must wear their hair away from the face and, if sufficiently long, secured in a bun.

Male students:

- White tee shirts, black tights, white socks, and white ballet shoes.

Students may not wear plastic pants, bike shorts, over-shirts, sweat clothes, or other extraneous or concealing garments during ballet classes. Students with minor injuries may wear close-fitting leg warmers (pink for females, black for males) at barre only. The Rock School reserves the right to dismiss any student for disregarding the dress code.

VII. RESIDENCE & ACADEMIC PROGRAM AGREEMENT - *Applicable for Residence & Academic Program Participants Only*

Residence Payment Agreement

Conditions

- Agreement effective for The Rock School's Residence program school-year session September 2011 - June 2012.
- All fees paid to The Rock School are non-refundable and non-transferable.
- Residence tuition includes a place in The School dormitory and a meal-plan at the R Café. The dormitory facility is part of a local condominium complex that includes a student lounge with kitchen and TV. The dormitory facility is monitored by Rock School residence staff.

- All residence students are to abide by The Rock School's Residence rules and regulations as set forth in the Residence Program 2011-2012 Handbook. Students in violation will be subject to disciplinary measures or dismissal from the program.
- There are limited amounts of space in The Rock School's Residence program. Spaces are filled on a first come, first served basis.

Payment Terms

- All residence students are responsible for the 2011-2012 Residence tuition of \$19,500, scholarship awards deducted if applicable.
- Residence tuition is paid in eight installments or annual basis.
- Eight installments are defined as eight equal payments, according to the following equation:
$$(\$19,500 - \text{Applicable Residence Scholarship}) / 8 = \text{Installment Payment}$$
- Payment due dates are as follows:

- Annual payment is defined as the total annual Residence tuition rate, minus applicable scholarships.
- Annual, pay-in-full payment is due upon registration.

Student Account Fee

- All Residence students are required to have a \$1,000 Student Account.
- Fee due upon deposit, if applicable.
- The \$1,000 Student Account shall be used to pay and reimburse The Rock School for any damage to Rock School property, dormitory property, or school facilities.
- The \$1000 Student Account shall be refundable at the end of the academic year if there are no damages.
- Returning families may elect to roll this fee over to the next year.
- If the Student Account falls below \$1,000 during the 2011-2012 school-year; the family will be billed to replenish the entire account to maintain the balance to \$1,000.

Scholarship Acceptance and Agreement

- All scholarship students are required to comply with The School's Scholarship Acceptance Agreement. A failure to comply will result in a verbal warning.
- Any such verbal warning may be followed by complete revocation of the Scholarship Award.

Expulsion or Dismissal

- In the event of an expulsion or dismissal by The School Directors, all Residence tuition paid to The Rock School, on behalf of any discharged student, is forfeited by the student.
- Students expelled or dismissed must return home within 48 hours of expulsion or dismissal. Families are responsible for all transportation fees from the Philadelphia area.
- Families are responsible for the remainder of Residence tuition for the 2011-2012 school-year in the event of a dismissal or expulsions.

Tuition Refund Insurance Plan

- The Rock School's Tuition Refund Insurance is mandated for each student who does not pay the full Residence tuition in advance, and has a material amount of total tuition due. A material amount is defined as \$5,000.
- Therefore, coverage is mandated for all students who owe more than \$5,000 to The School in Residence and/or Academic tuition, for the 2011-2012 school-year; and do not pay-in-full.
- The 2011-2012 Tuition Insurance fee is \$375, and due upon deposit, if applicable.

Rock Academic Program Alliance Payment Agreement

- Agreement effective for The Rock School's Rock Academic Program Alliance school-year session September 2011 - June 2012.
- All fees paid to The Rock School are non-refundable and non-transferable.
- Rock Academic Program Alliance (hereinafter "Academic") tuition includes:
 - Laptop computer issued by The Rock School. The computer shall be leased to the student and will remain the property of The School. Students are responsible for their issued computer at all times, 24-hours a day. The personal laptop computer must be returned by the student in acceptable condition at the end of the school -year.
 - Five (5) regular or honors Keystone School courses, academic and technical support, individualized and small-group instruction, RAPA-specific classes, SAT preparation and transportation, and several social activities for the school year.
 - Textbooks shall be leased to the students and will remain the property of The School. Textbooks that are not returned or are returned unusable by student will be billed to the family of student at fair market value plus a 15% restocking fee.
- All Academic students are to abide by The Rock School's Academic rules and regulations as set forth in the 2011-2012 Rock Academics Handbook. Students in violation will be subject to disciplinary measures or dismissal from the program.
- There are limited amounts of space in The Rock School's Academic program. Spaces are filled on a first come, first served basis.

Payment Terms

- All Academic students are responsible for the 2011-2012 annual Academic tuition; \$10,085 for grades 9-12 and \$8,585 for grades 7-8, scholarship awards deducted if applicable. The 2011-2012 Academic tuition includes an \$85 technology and computer fee.
- Academic tuition is paid in eight installments or annual basis.
- Eight installments are defined as eight equal payments, according to the following equation:
$$(\text{Annual Academic tuition} - \text{Applicable Academic Scholarship}) / 8 = \text{Installment Payment}$$
- Payment due dates are as follows:

Student Account

- All Academic students are required to have a \$1,000 Student Account. Fee due upon deposit, if applicable.



The Rock School for Dance Education| System for Tuition, Admission & Registration Handbook 2011-2012

- The \$1,000 Student Account shall be used to pay and reimburse The Rock School for any damage to Rock School property, dormitory property, school facilities or any damage/theft (on or off campus) of Rock School-issued personal laptop computers.
- The \$1000 Student Account shall be refundable at the end of the academic year if there are no damages.
- Returning families may elect to roll this fee over to the next year.
- If the Student Account falls below \$1,000 during the 2011-2012 school-year; the family will be billed to replenish the entire account to maintain the balance to \$1,000.

Scholarship Acceptance and Agreement

- All scholarship students are required to comply with The School's Scholarship Acceptance Agreement. A failure to comply will result in a verbal warning.
- Any such verbal warning may be followed by complete revocation of the Scholarship Award and expulsion from The Rock School.

Expulsion or Dismissal

- In the event of an expulsion or dismissal by The School Directors, all Academic tuition paid to The Rock School, on behalf of any discharged student, is forfeited by the student.
- Students expelled or dismissed must return home within 48 hours of expulsion or dismissal. Families are responsible for all transportation fees from the Philadelphia area.
- Families are responsible for the remainder of Academic tuition for the 2011-2012 school-year in the event of a dismissal or expulsions.

Tuition Refund Insurance Plan

- The Rock School's Tuition Refund Insurance is mandated for each student who does not pay the full Academic tuition in advance, and has a material amount of total tuition due. A material amount is defined as \$5,000.
- Therefore, coverage is mandated for all students who owe more than \$5,000 to The School in Residence and/or Academic tuition, for the 2011-2012 school-year; and do not pay-in-full.
- The 2011-2012 Tuition Insurance fee is \$375, and due upon deposit, if applicable.
- Coverage is as follows.

Students participating in the 2011-2012 Residence and Academic programs are required to have only one \$1,000 Student Account. The Account is shared between programs, therefore two separate \$1,000 Student Accounts are not required.
